Pledge month November 2009

A children's rights pledge is a public promise by a decision-maker to take action to improve children's rights in the local area.

During **pledge month**, *Get ready for change!* campaigners will be encouraging their local decision-makers to make a children's rights pledge. It's even more important this year because we are celebrating 20 years of children's rights!

What is a public pledge?

A public pledge is written promise made by an adult decision-maker that will improve the lives of children and young people in their area, and make sure their human rights are respected.

As a Get ready for change! campaigner, we want you to encourage at least one important decision-maker to make a promise for children!

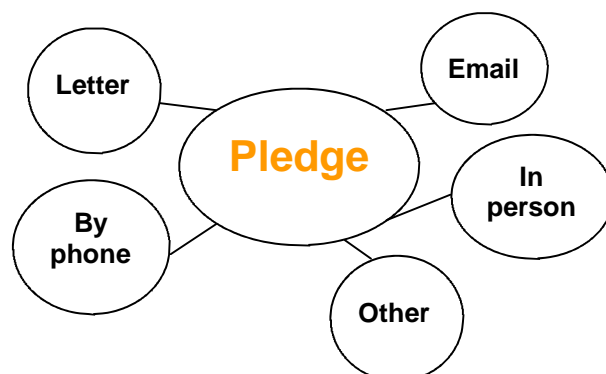

Remember to:

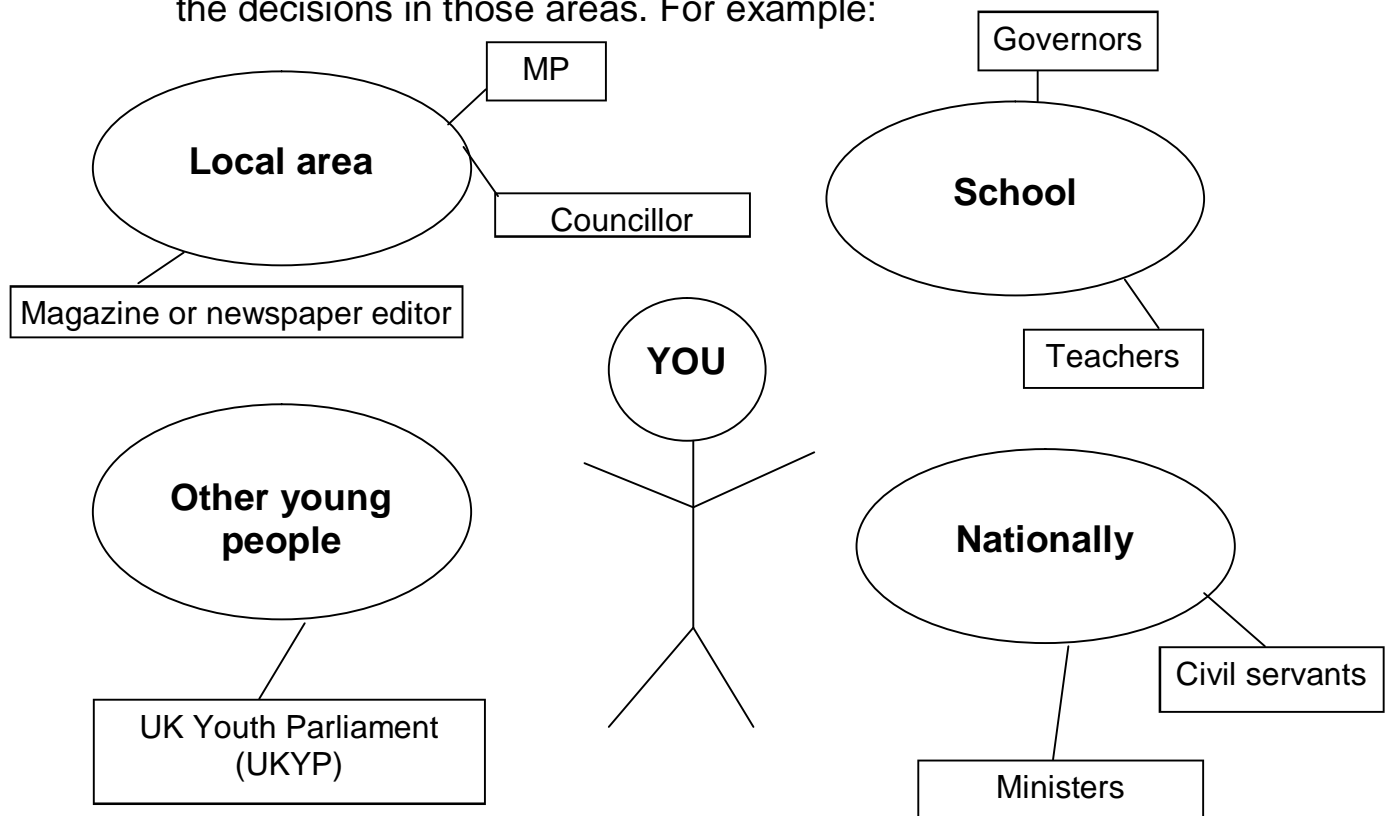
- Explain what the *Get ready for change!* project is about
- Explain what kind of pledge you would like them to make
- Try and get them to make a pledge straight away!
- Remind them to make their pledge online if they have said they will!

Decision-makers

Who makes the decisions where you live?

This will help you work out who makes the decisions that affect you in your local area.

- Draw a picture of yourself in the middle of a piece of paper
- Draw 4 circles around it, and label them like the ones below
- Write down the names or job titles of as many people who make the decisions in those areas. For example:



Extra bits...

Why not think of the different ways you can communicate with your decision-makers?

- **Make a list of different ways of communicating with people and match these up with the different people in your network**

Would you communicate with your parent or carer in the same way that you would communicate with your MP?

Now you have worked out who your decision-makers are, contact them! Encourage them to make their pledge on the *Get ready for change!* site.

Remember:

Everyone makes decisions ALL the time – what are the most important ones for children and young people?
